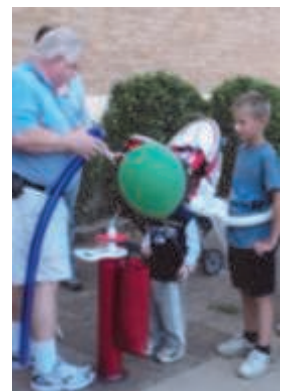



I was sorry to miss the parish picnic - but understand it was another well attended and thoroughly enjoyable event. I also missed the first annual Youth Volleyball Game on Sunday - but it was a success as well. **The Good News**

**I've been told about a TV show called "What NOT to Wear", where two fashion experts fly a woman to New York** for a "renewal" of hair, make-up, and clothing. These two fashion experts believe firmly in the beauty of every person. Most women end up saying, "I didn't respect myself, or feel any dignity," and "I feel transformed inside. They helped me find my real beauty." Today, Jesus is urging and inviting the religious leaders to accept another form of transformation: a vision of life in which you actually practice what you preach--how refreshing! One son says "I'll go to the vineyard" but doesn't; and the other says, "I won't go," but then changes his mind, and goes.

The Jewish leaders had said "we obey" but didn't; while the prostitutes said "no way", but then did follow God's ways. This gospel is about seeking consistency between our words and our deed. But to replace an old behavior with a new one mean getting rid of the "old clothes." We have to change our exterior behavior, which triggers inner transformation. We have to empty ourselves of anything, in fact, which is not helping us live for God.

As St. Paul says, "Have this mind among yourselves, which was in Christ Jesus... (who) emptied himself." So, let us prepare for our transformation. Jesus is asking us to listen again, and do what it takes to receive our inner and outer make-over. Prepare to see your true beauty!

## School News

*From the Principal:*

**This week's academic overview is of our math program.** The Archdiocesan course of study in math provides the classroom teacher with identifiable and measurable objectives at each grade level, and aligns classroom instruction with both the national and state standards for math.



Students who have mastered all grade level objectives and display an above grade level ability with the math curriculum and on standardized tests may be chosen to participate in the Algebra program in their 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade years. This is a high school level class designed to move students into Algebra II or Geometry as a freshman in high school. Students in the Algebra program study real number properties applied to algebraic expressions, and solve equations and inequalities. Other topics include: factoring, polynomials, rational expressions, graphing, functions, irrational numbers, quadratic formulas, and statistics.

Through the month of October students in grades 2-8 will be taking the Iowa Test of Basic Skills. This standardized test is not a mastery test, but is designed to find out how much a student knows. The purpose of the testing is to identify strengths and weaknesses of students, monitor year to year development, and provide feedback to students and parents. Along with the Iowa test students will be given a cognitive abilities test which is designed to predict academic success, **how fast a student learns, and the student's ability to see relationship of numbers.** In looking at all of this information we are better able to design a curriculum to meet the needs of our school families.

Students and staff celebrated World Peace Day on Wednesday of this past week. A prayer service that included; **readings, songs, and the placement of "Peace Pinwheels"** was held on the front lawn of school. It was an awesome experience for all the students!
