School News

From the Principal:



In the summer of 2010, Archbishop Schnurr outlined a desire to establish a unified vision for Catholic school education in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. The Executive Summary that follows is a highlight of the main points of the Initial Assessment Report for *Lighting the Way*.

These are just general observations that emerged from the initial data. The vision should be defined in the late summer of 2012.

Catholic Identity/Faith Formation:

1. There is great interest in Catholic identity among the people of the Archdiocese.
2. The available number (48,000) of Catholic school-age children in the Archdiocese is decreasing.
3. Roughly one-third of parish-registered Catholic children in the Archdiocese are enrolled in Catholic schools.

Academic Excellence:

1. Catholic schools are generally well regarded in this area.
2. Catholic schools are generally out-performing other schools when compared on both a local and national scale.
3. The instruction of students with defined Special Needs should be considered in the final vision and plan.

Finances:

1. The financial state of Catholic schools is varied, and generally tied to demographics and the health of the sponsoring parish.
2. The average cost of education per pupil is \$4,500.00. St. Albert's cost to educate is approximately \$4,300.00.
3. There is a need to make tuition affordable to all families by finding more sources of financial aid on the local and Archdiocesan levels.
