From the Pastor

Dear People of St. Albert the Great...

I understand from our Youth Director, Karen Fitzharris, that we have had great response to our new youth group. As busy **as our young people are these days it's great** to know that they are getting involved in activities here at their parish once they get into Jr High and High School. We were blessed finding Karen who is enthusiastic and committed to this ministry. Fr Ned has been helping her and they make a great team. I thank her for her efforts and encourage our young people to be a part of this group. Today the Youth Group is having a Dog Wash as a fund raiser before the Blessing of the Pets. They plan to attend a national youth event in November and this will help with the fees.

I know it seems early to talk about Christmas, but our Advent – Christmas Planning Group needs some guidance from you. The Good News

There was once a shy, skinny, 100-pound kid from New Jersey named Eugene who tried out javelin throwing in high school. School News

From the Principal:

This week's curriculum overview is of the science and technology programs. The primary objective of the science program is to help students develop an understanding of the various areas of science, while developing skills needed for scientific inquiry. The subjects include: earth/space, life/biological, and physical science. Students are also encouraged to learn through hands-on activities, field trips, and school assemblies. Our newest and most successful hands-on learning module is the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) program which is offered in grades K-6 grade.



The use of computers and other electronic technology are integrated throughout the curriculum developed by Saint Albert the Great School. In addition to computers in each classroom, our computer lab is state-of-the-art and our 30 laptop computers are available to students for classroom instruction.

The month of October is set aside for the Iowa Test of Basic Skills. This standardized test is designed to identify strengths and weaknesses of students, monitor year to year development, and provide feedback to students and parents. Traditionally, Saint Albert the Great School scores above the 70 percentile nationally.
