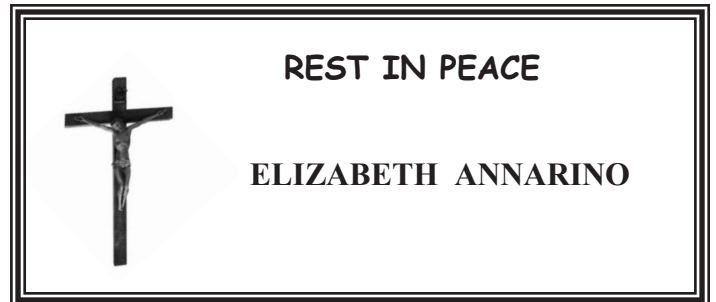

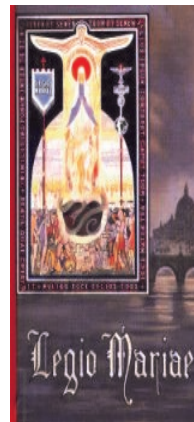

**School News**

**From the Principal:**

According to the fourth commandment, God has willed that after him, we should honor our parents and those whom he has vested with authority for our good. **Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2248**



"Honor your father and your mother" is one of the most fundamental obligations we have under the heading of respect and obedience. However, the fourth commandment also tells us that we have an obligation not just to our parents but to all representatives of God on earth.

As members of the Catholic Church, we must respect and obey the highest spiritual authority given to us by Jesus, Pope Benedict XVI. We are also called to obey our bishops, priests, and others holding authority in the Church and they in turn must devote their lives to guiding and guarding the spiritual welfare of those in their care. Disrespect, contempt, and disobedience toward them are sinful.

As citizens of the United States, we have an obligation to show respect and obedience to lawful civil authority, whether on the national, state, or local level. We have a duty to obey laws, not merely avoid the penalty for breaking them, because those in authority hold their authority from God. Our leaders must have moral integrity, which means following the principles of Christ in whatever position one holds.

Much like our obligations as adults, the students of Saint Albert the Great must be respectful and obey the teachers, administration, and volunteers that have been given the authority to maintain an orderly school environment. Since parents are recognized as the first and most important educator in their child's life and they have given a portion of that parental obligation to the school, any child showing disobedience or disrespect at school is not only breaking our school rules, but they are also not honoring their parents and therefore breaking the fourth commandment.

Saint Paul says it best about the obedience that we owe to those in authority; "Let everyone obey the authorities that are over him, for there is not authority except from God, and all authority that exists is established by God. (Romans 13:1)
